Werkleitz Festival 2021 move to ... Conference and Discourse Programme new world dis/order

From 18 June to 4 July the conference and discourse programme *new world dis/order* – in cooperation with the German Federal Cultural Foundation and supported by the ZEIT Foundation – will guide audiences through the themes of the three main spheres of the 2021 Werkleitz Festival *move to* ... *sociosphere*, *ecosphere*, *bodydatasphere*.

On three consecutive weekends renowned theorists, researchers and artists will discuss and reflect on phenomena of our present and the near future. The programme features over 20 lectures, conversations and performances. It will be streamed from the former headquarters of the East German Ministry of State Security in Halle (Saale) and be supplemented by features and podcasts. In multiple studios media art by grantees of the European Media Art Platform (EMAP) will be documented on film. On-site visits will be possible in compliance with hygienic rules. From 18 June on selected film productions by several award-winning EMAP artists – including Chloé Galibert-Laîné (FR), Kevin B. Lee (US/DE) and Total Refusal (AT) – will be presented on the festival website.

New perspectives and strategies for the societal, ecological and technological challenges of the future

In the course of the previous year, there has been a lot of talk about new world orders – and even about the disorder that the world has devolved into. Historical elections, the omnipresent pandemic and the climate crisis looming over us all have swelled the upheaval of our globalized and digitalized living environment to dimensions never seen before. Seemingly ever more brutal culture and information wars and the use of tracking technologies straight out of surveillance capitalism have been part of our everyday digitalized reality



for quite some time. Infrastructures that encompass the entire planet and an economic system based on endless growth are phenomena of our present age and of a society changing at breakneck speed. In what kind of a future world do we want to live? How do we rise to meet its social, ecological and technological challenges? Casting a critical view on the past and present, focus will also be placed on the urgent need to find new forms of collective reason and common action.
